What's a Zine?




- short for magazine
- non-commercial
- DIY / DIT ((Do-It-Yourself/Do-It-Together)
- contains original and/or appropriated text and images
- self-published
- often reproduced with a photocopier
- small circulation


Zines were used in non-Western contexts and cultures, as everyday people creatively made political, and often subversive, ideas public.




Chinese dazibao ("big-character posters" or wall-mounted newspapers), which used self-publishing as an activist and cultural tool during the Democracy Wall Movement in 1978. Activists also placed hand-made journals along the wall.

70s punk culture – emergence of self-publishing within underground music scene.






1980s and 1990s – *Queercore* and *Riot Grrrl* movements used zines to establish community and share experiences


