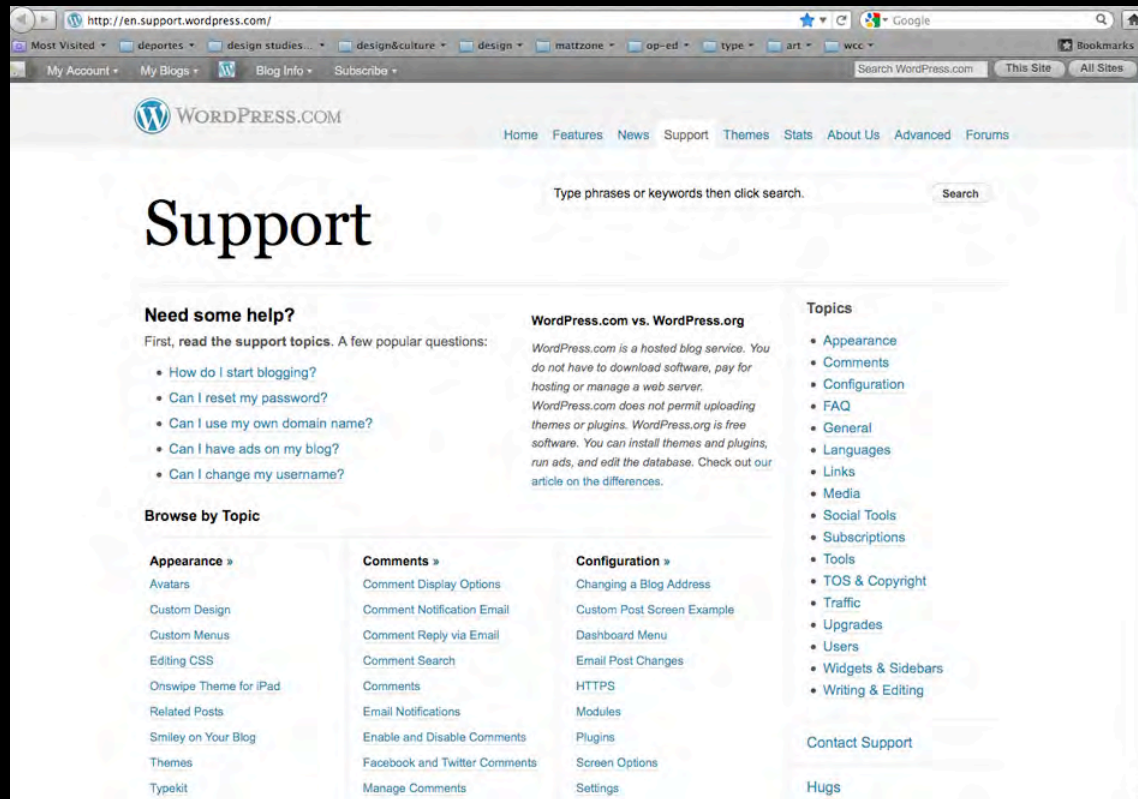

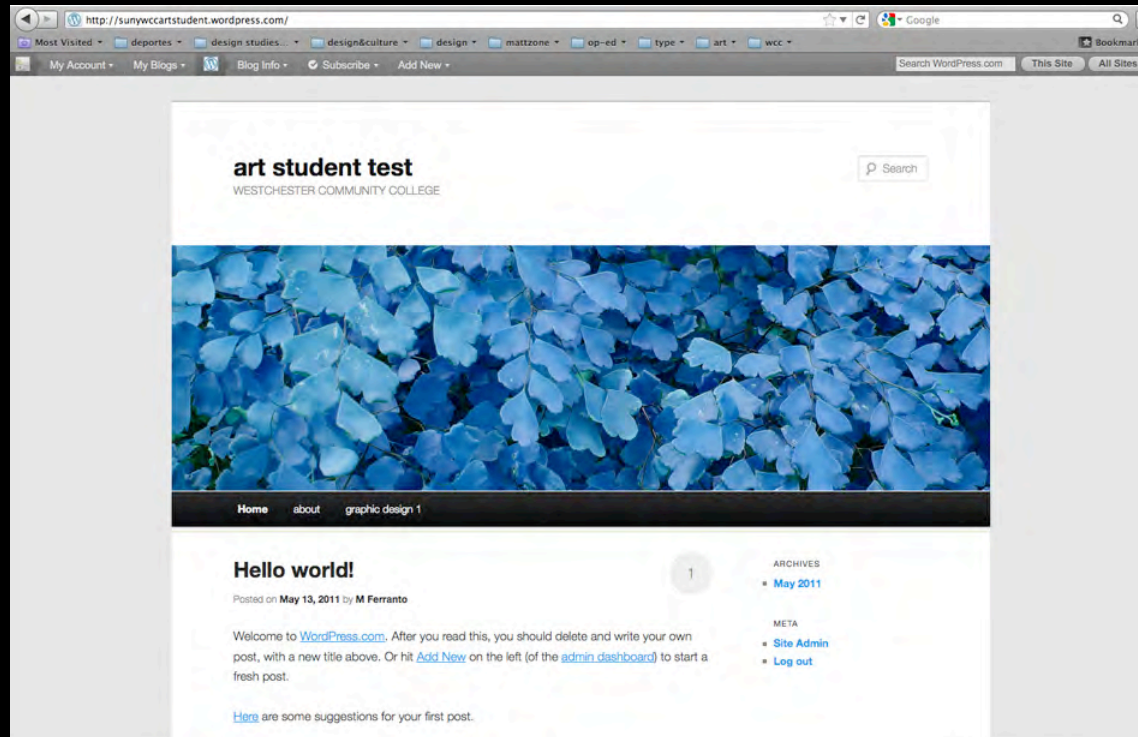

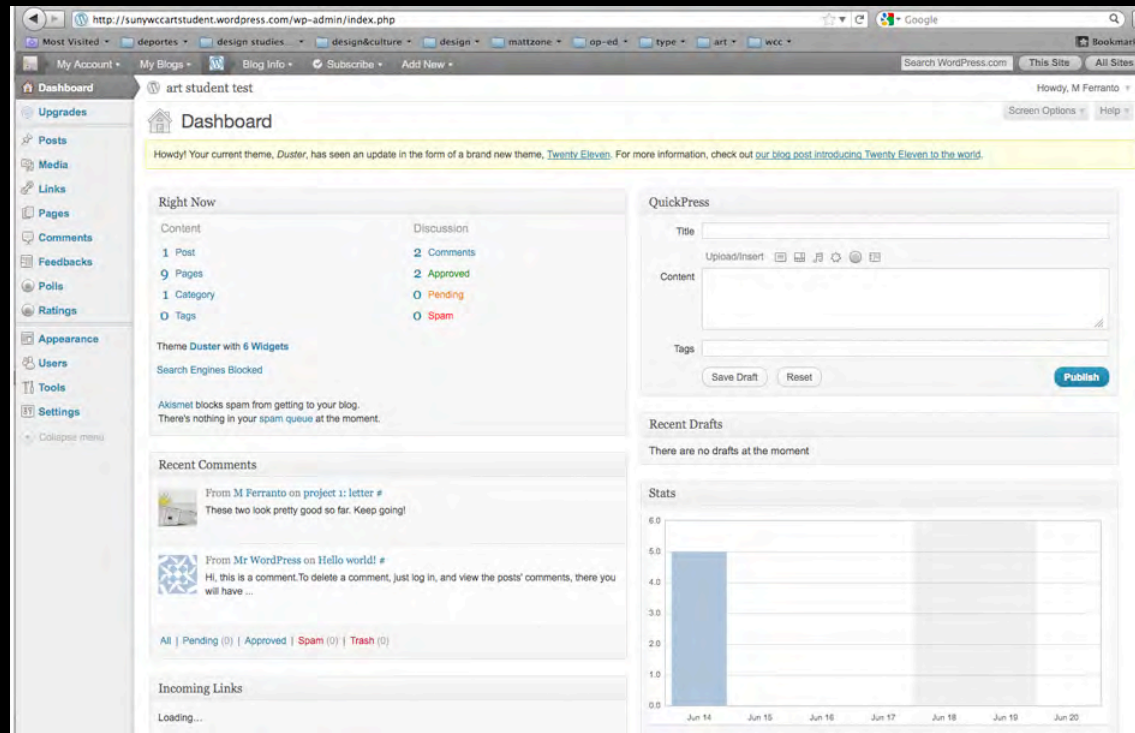

Back end or “dashboard” – where you create pages & upload images and texts to your site



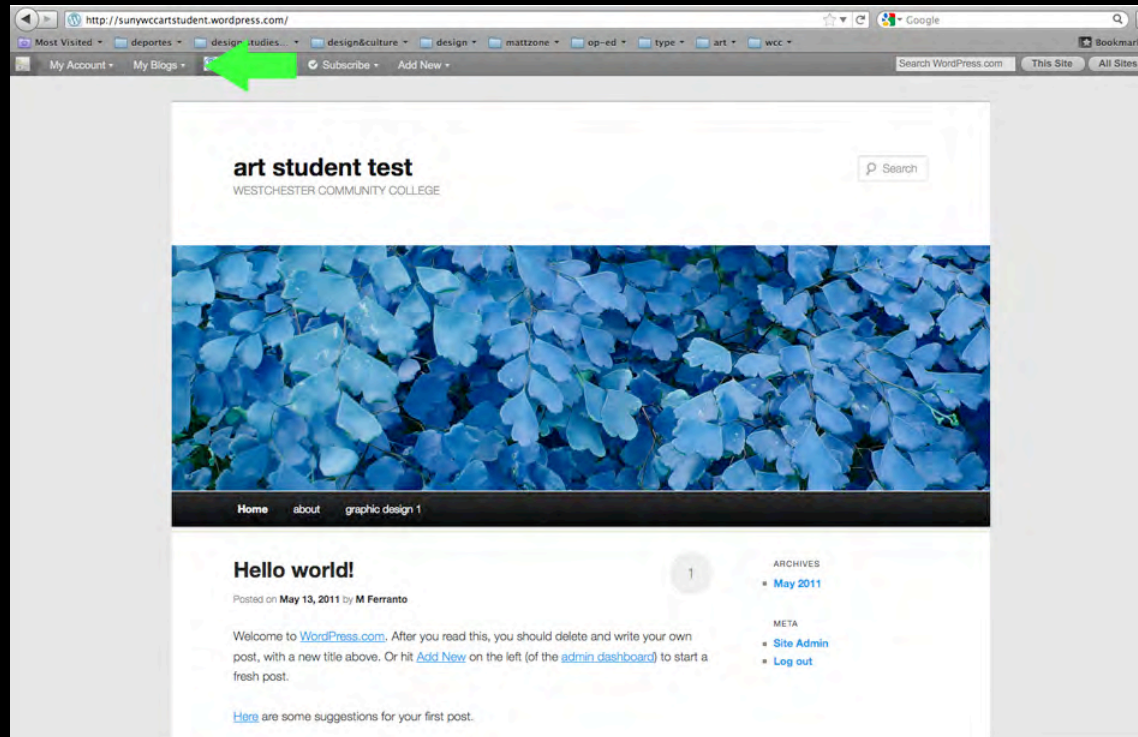

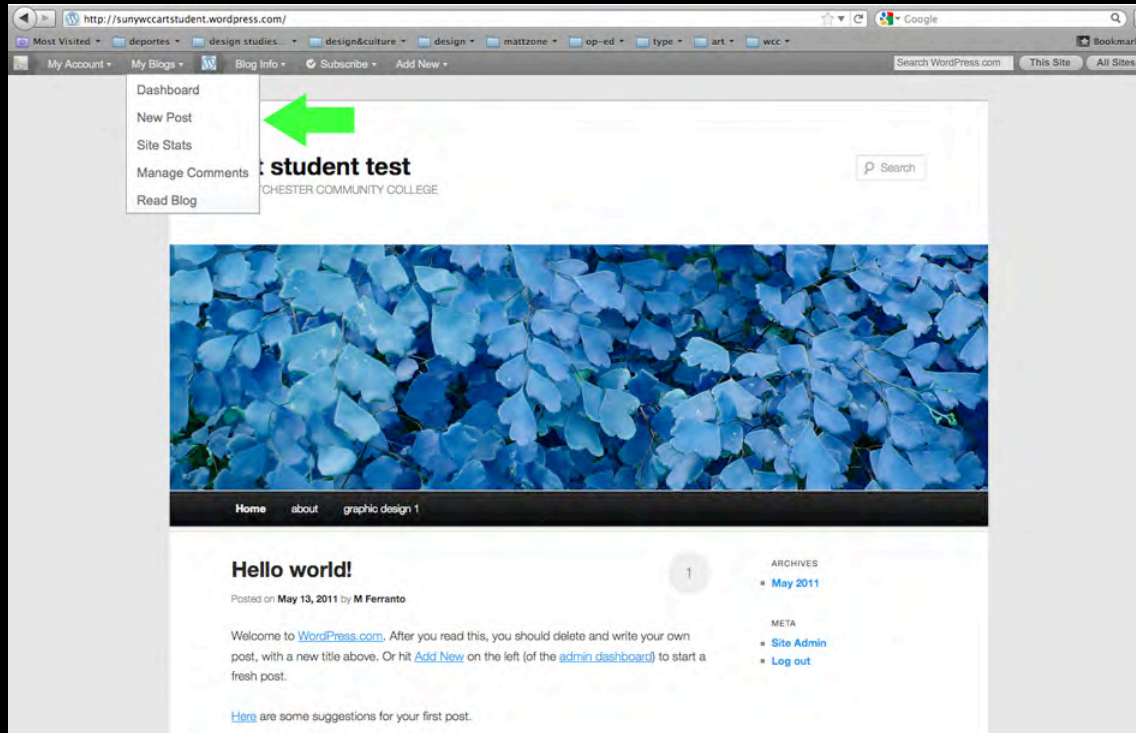

dashboard and front end

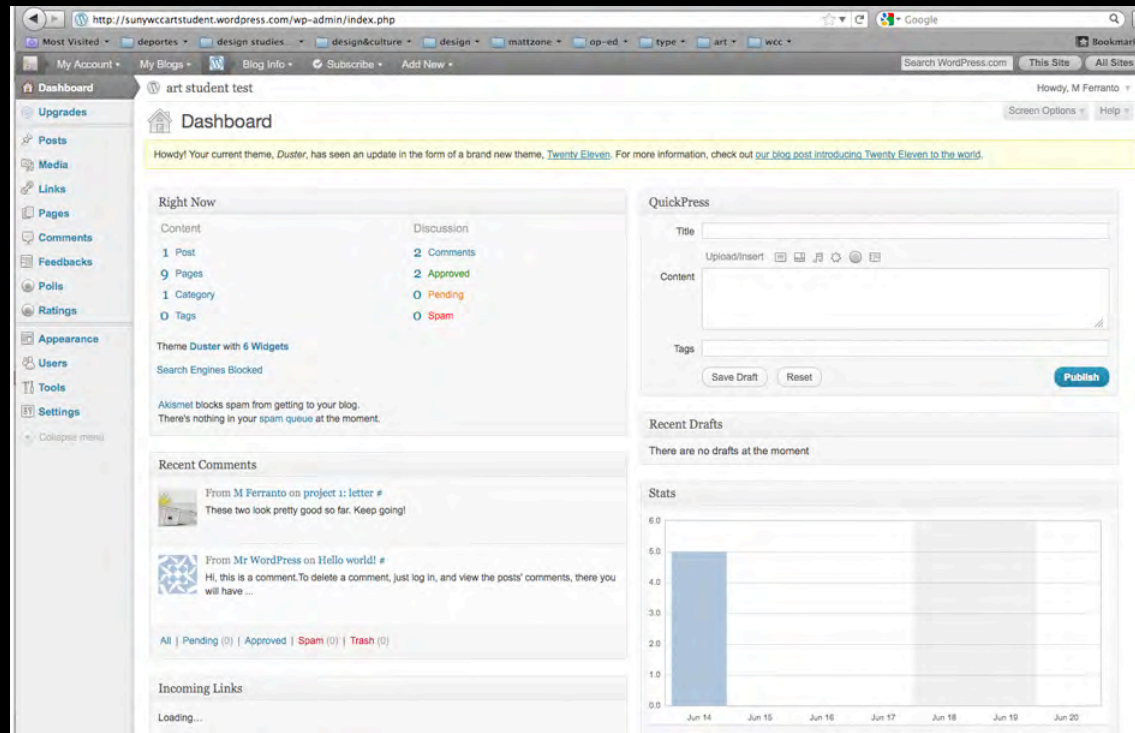

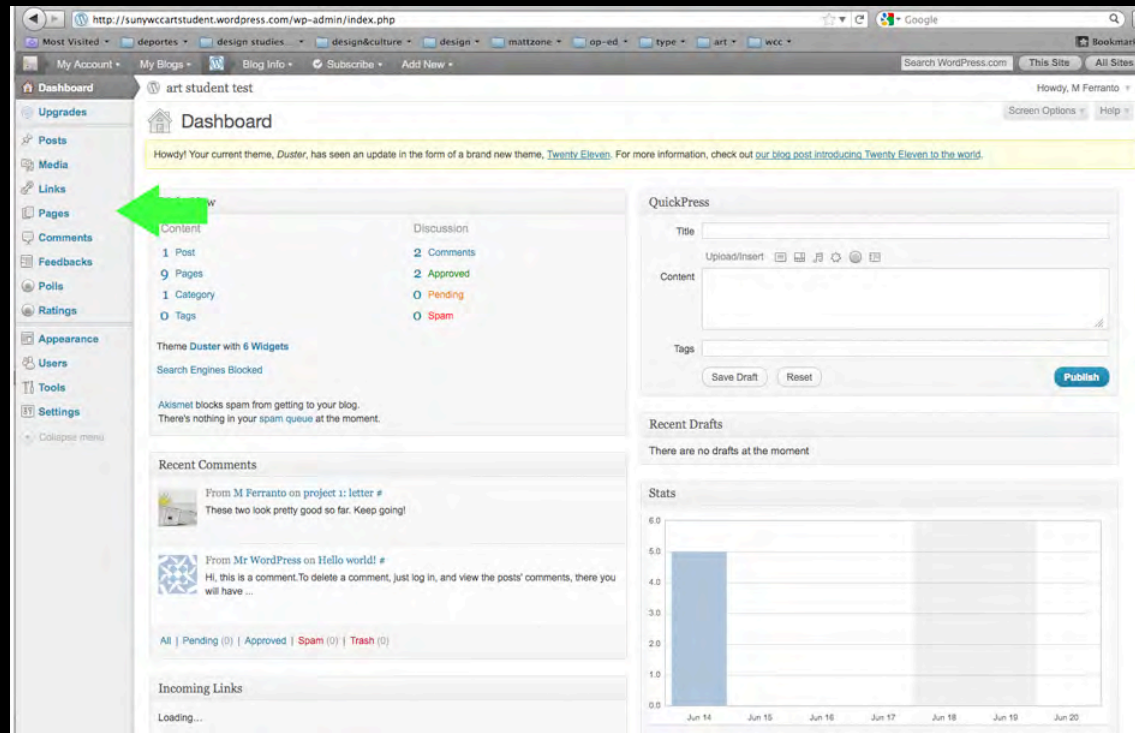

Most of our work will take place in the “pages” section of the dashboard.



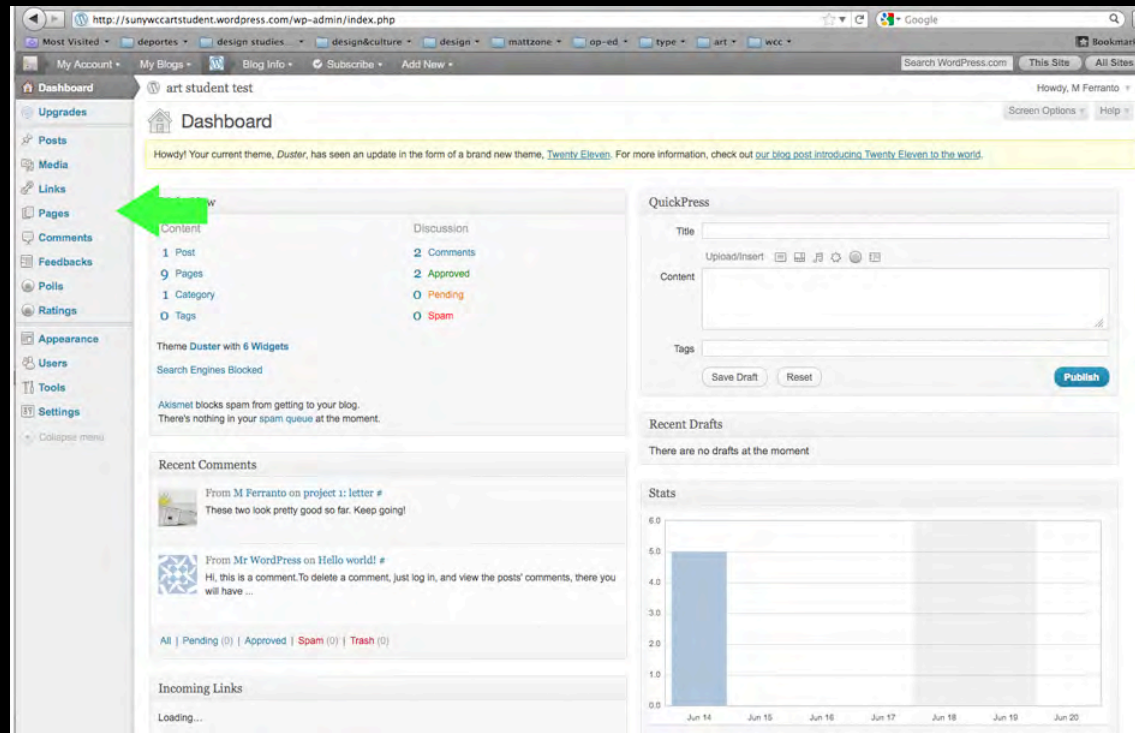

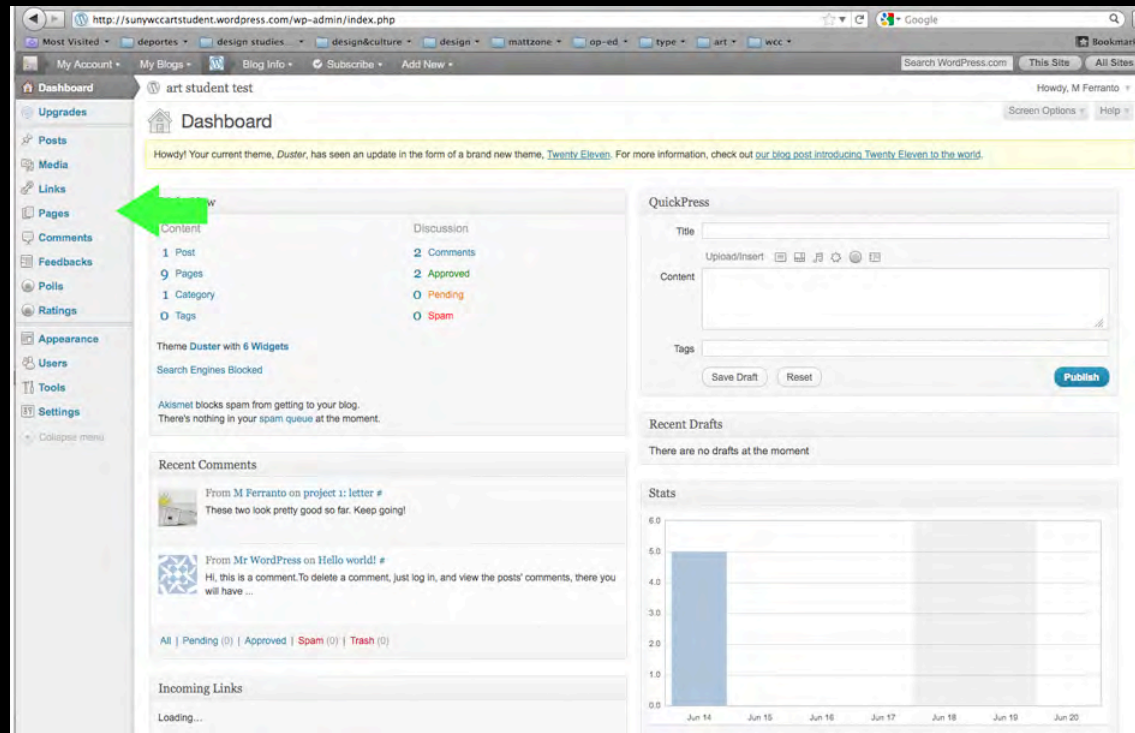


Wordpress.com pages

Any page you create in the dashboard will automatically appear on the main menu of the site's front end.

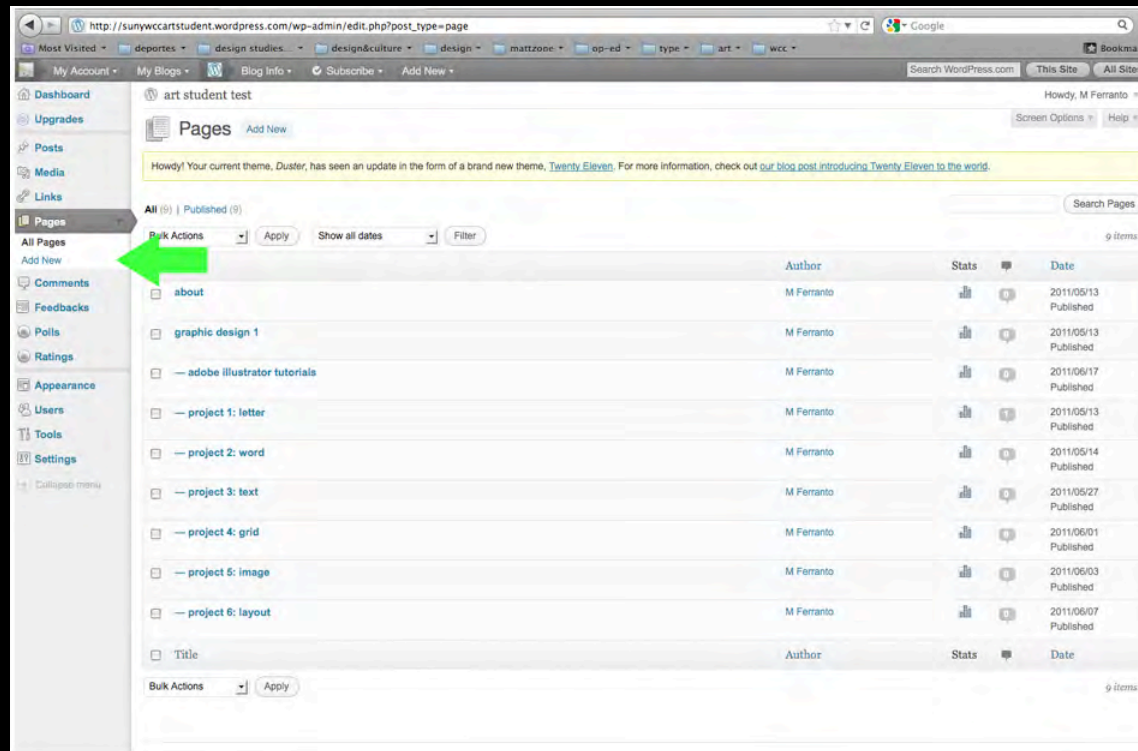

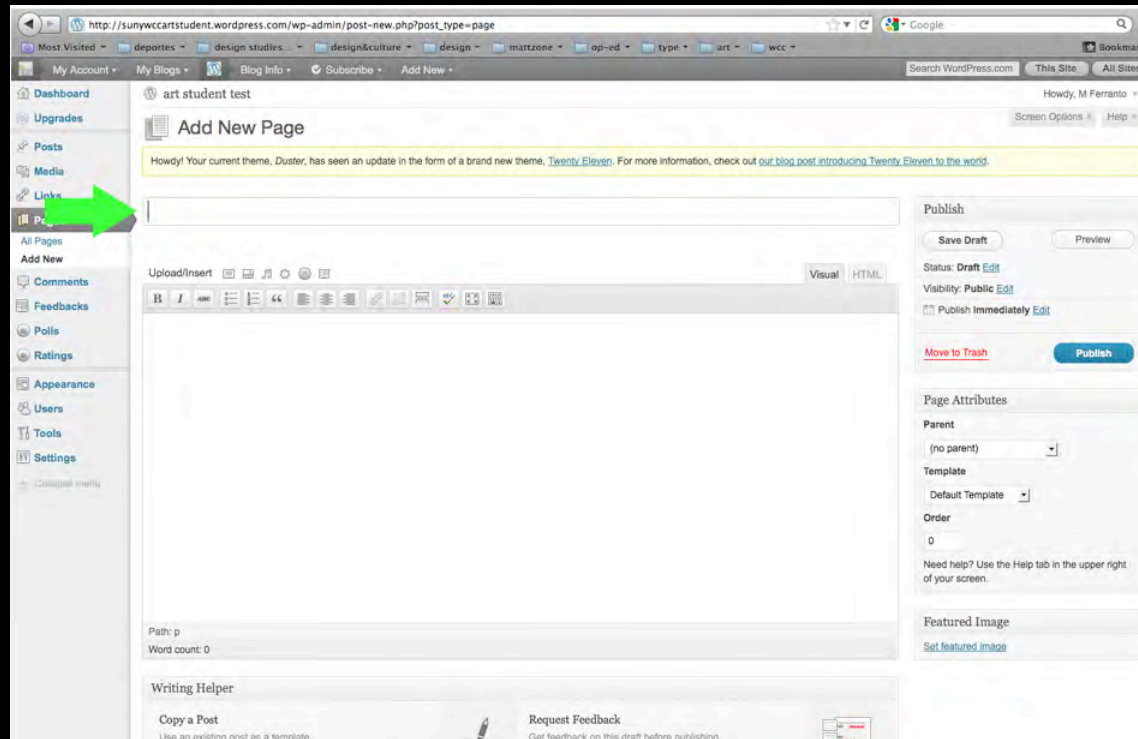

1. Click on the “Pages” link in the left menu of the dashboard. This will open up the “Pages” screen.



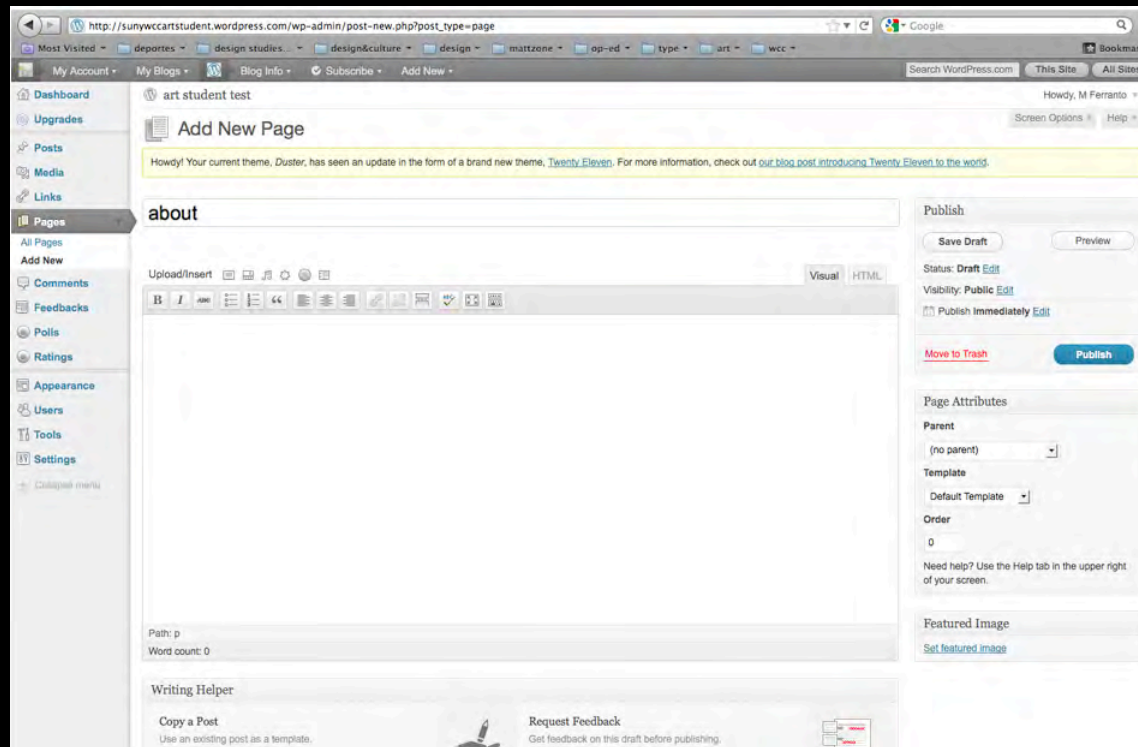

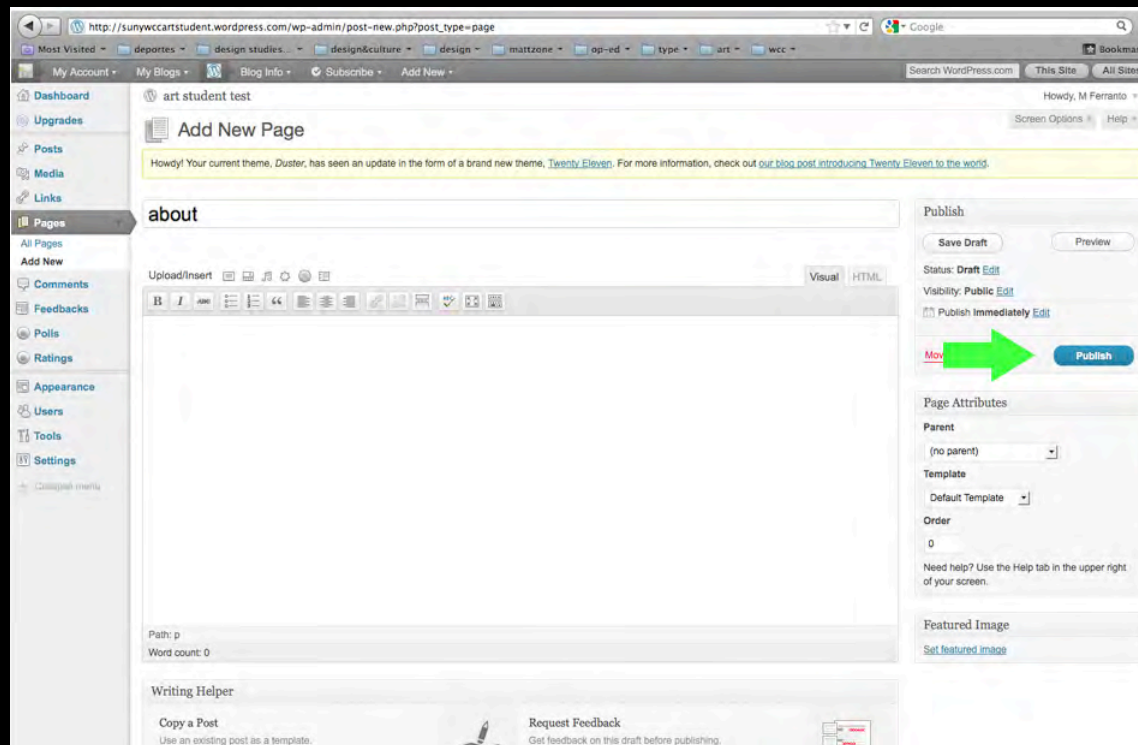

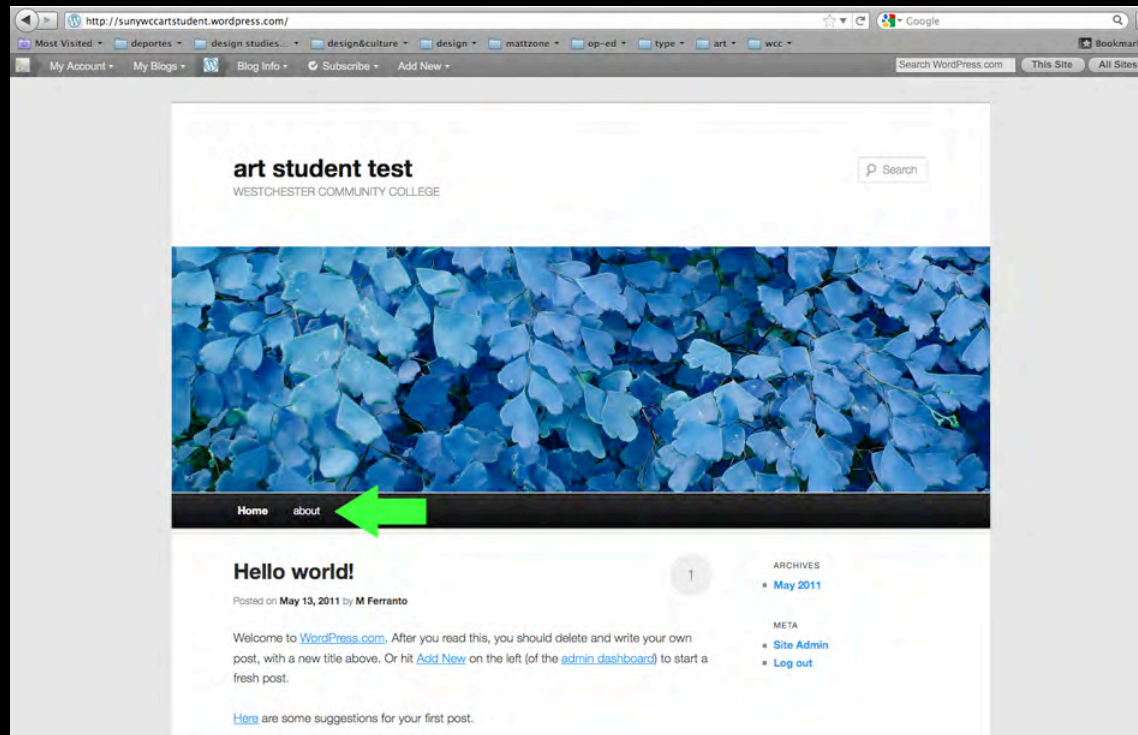

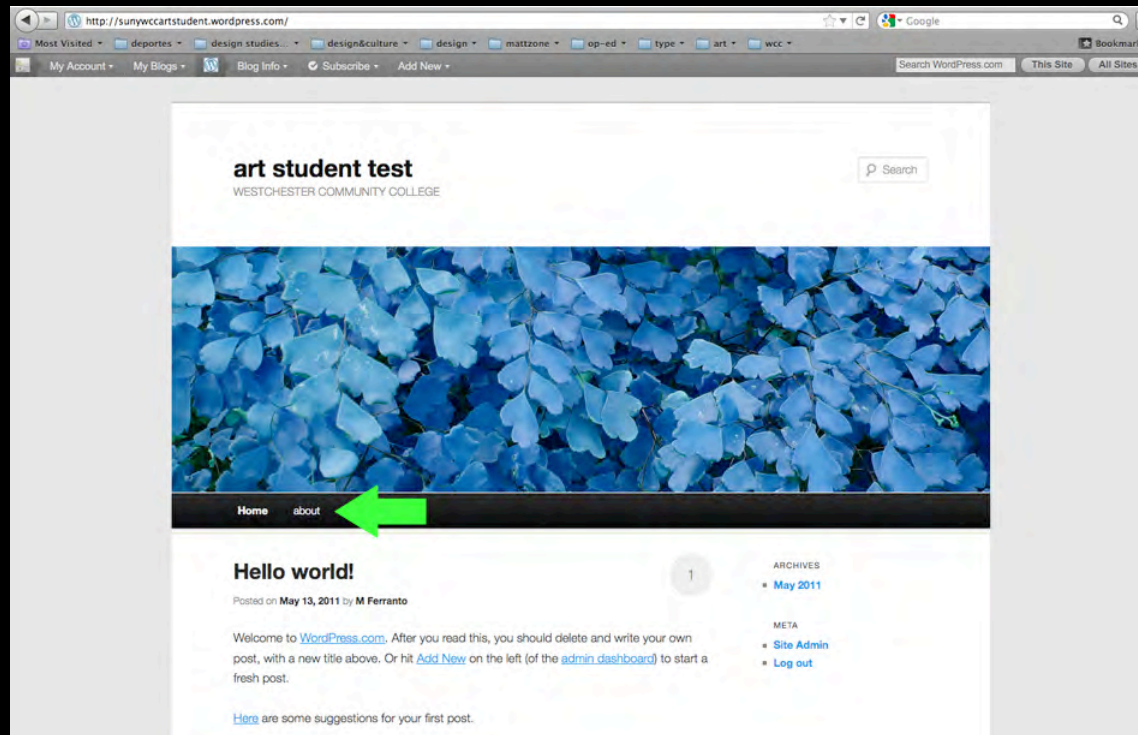

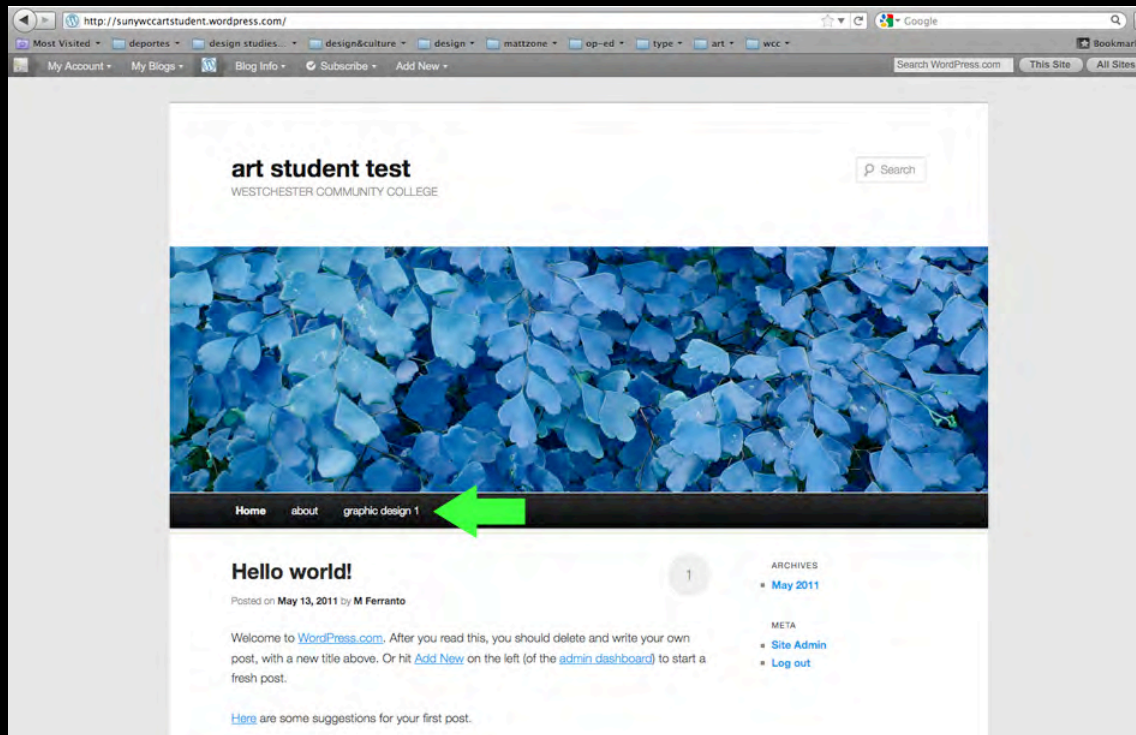

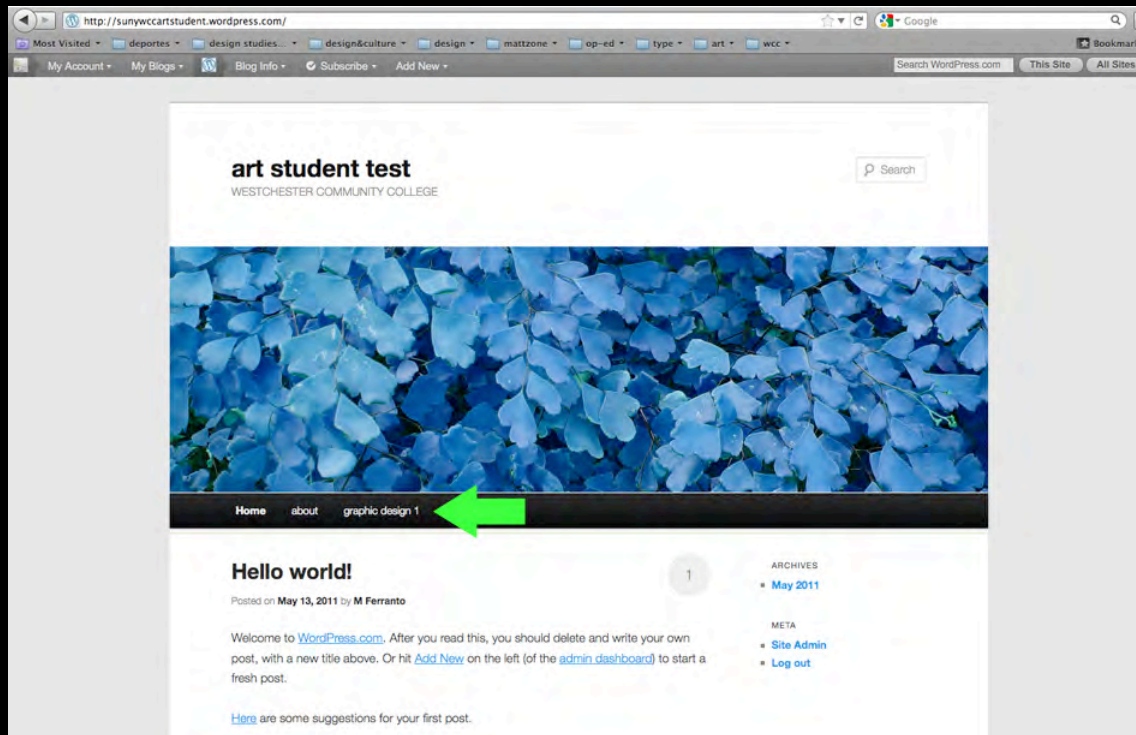

Child pages will appear in a drop down menu under a main page in the front end main menu.



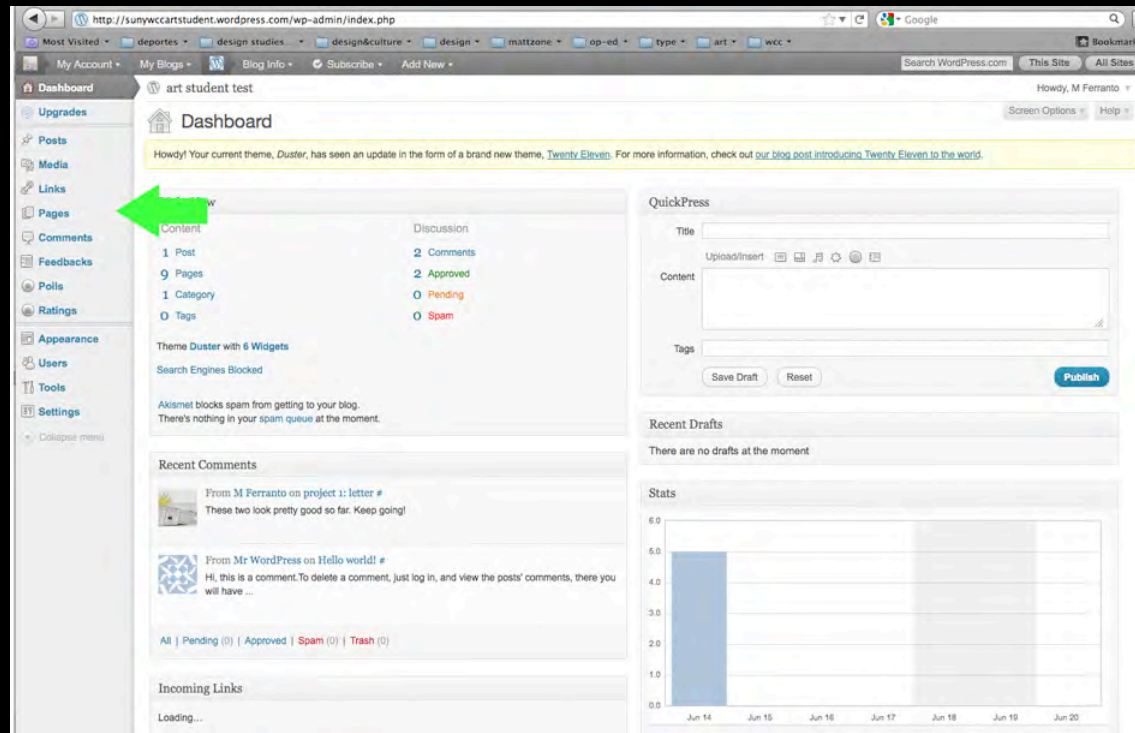

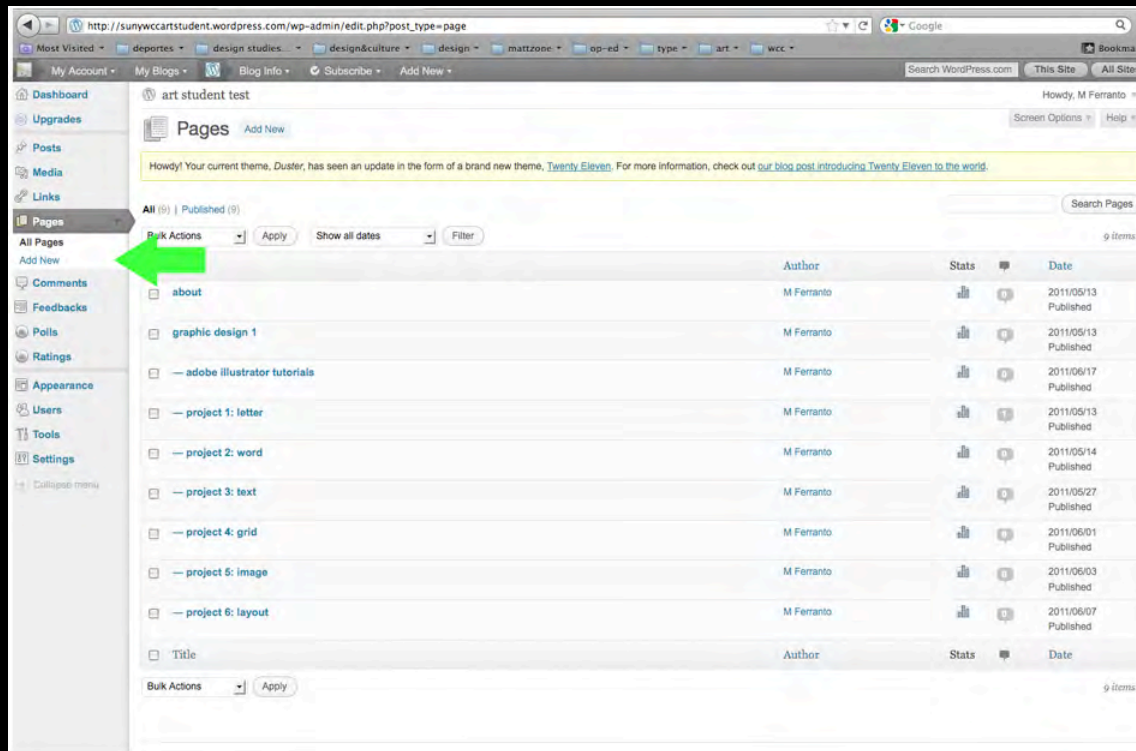

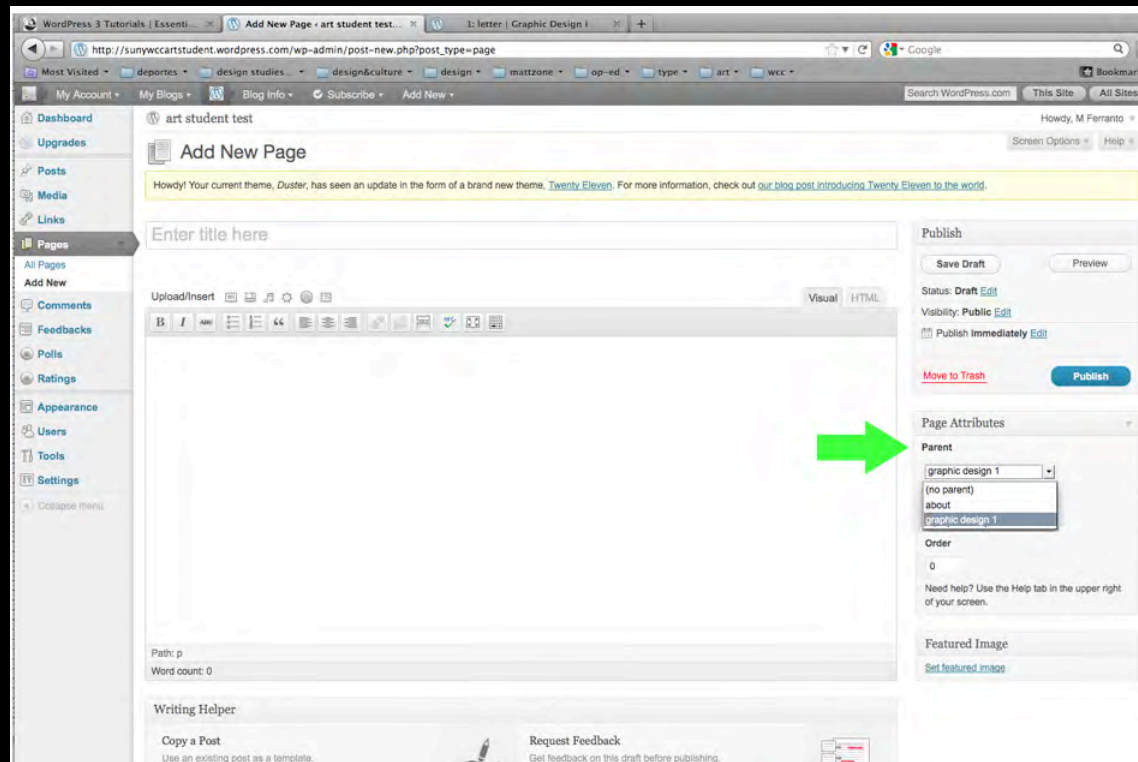

1. Click on the “Pages” link in the left menu of the dashboard. This will open up the “Pages” screen.



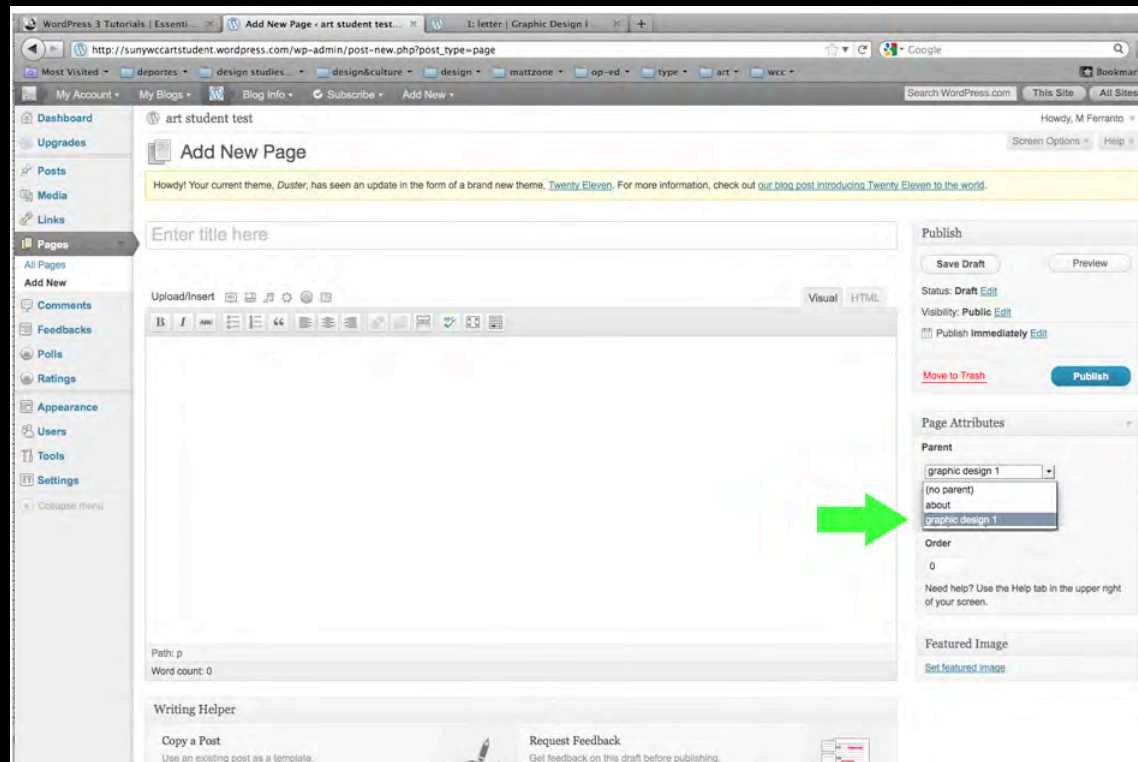

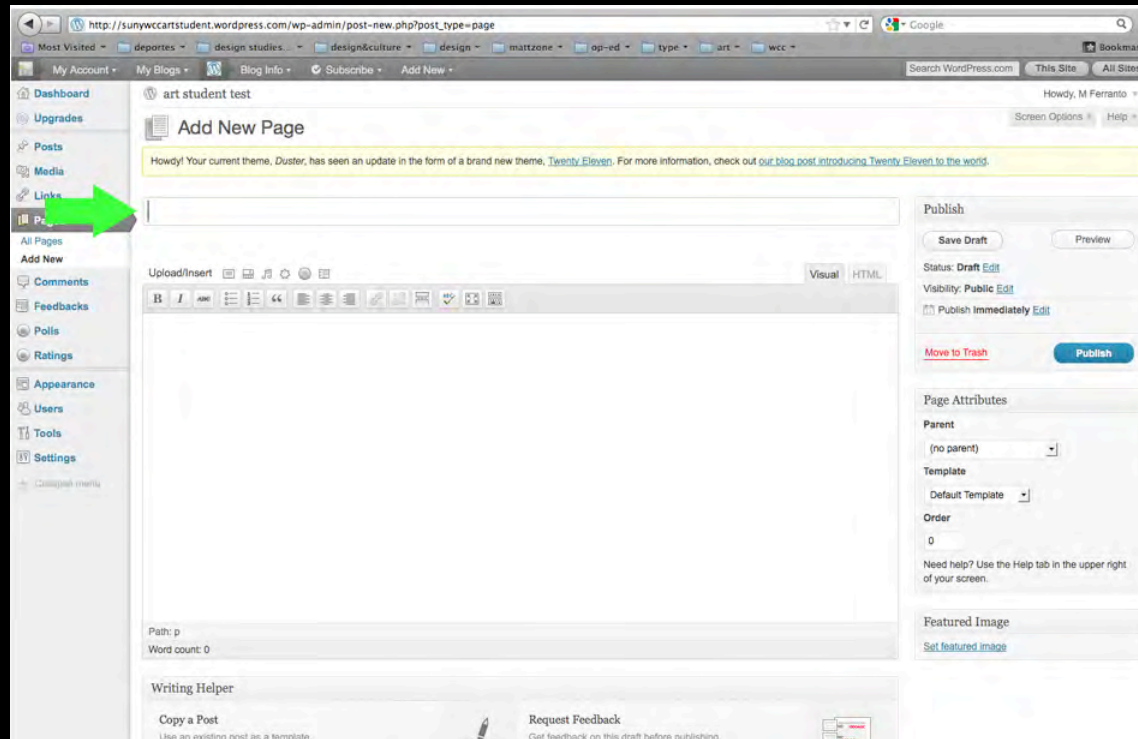

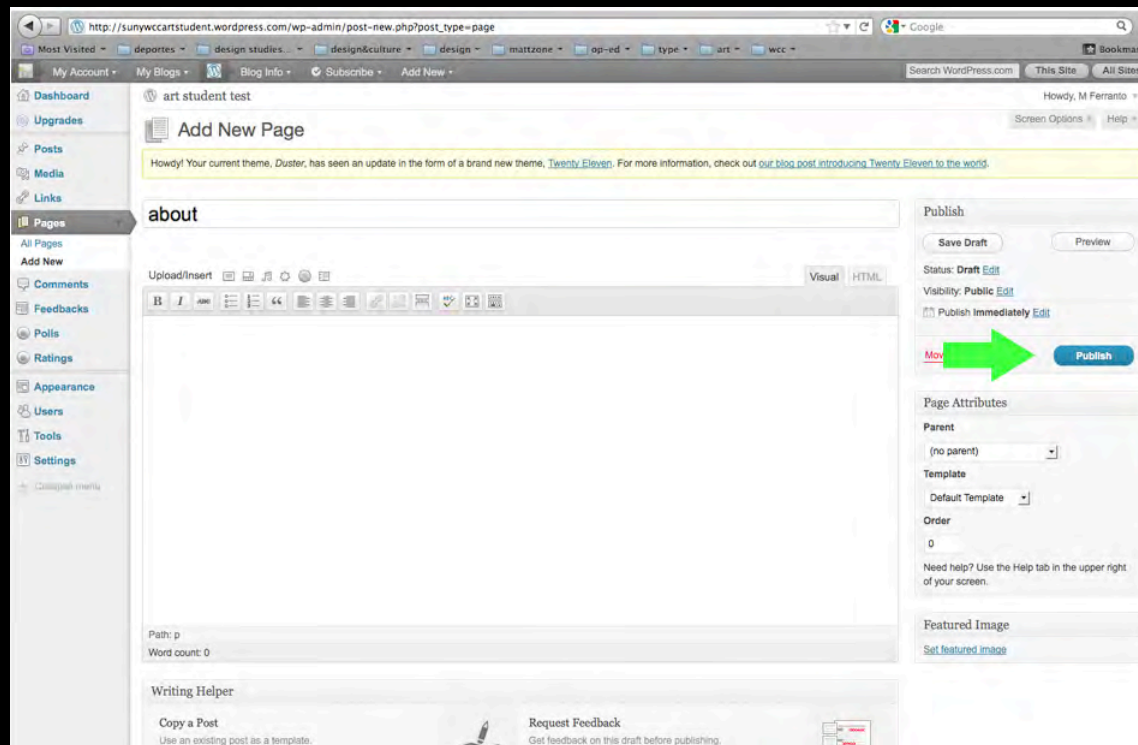

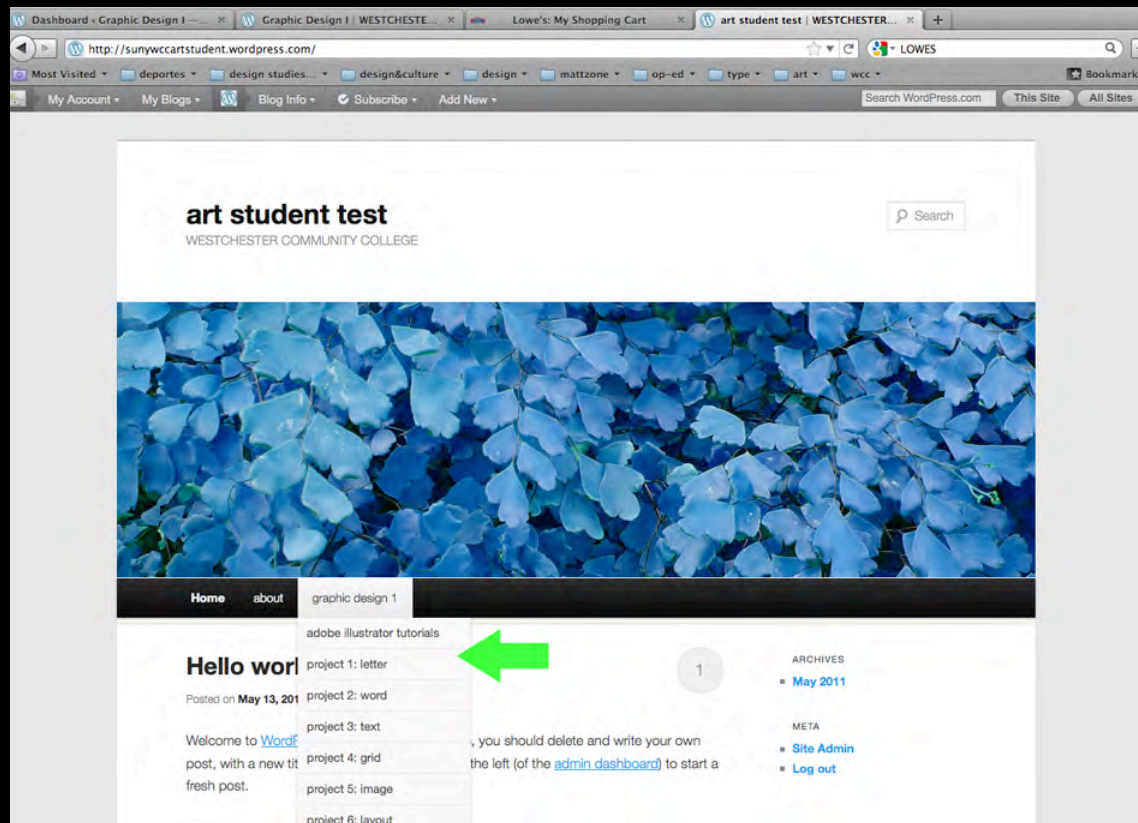

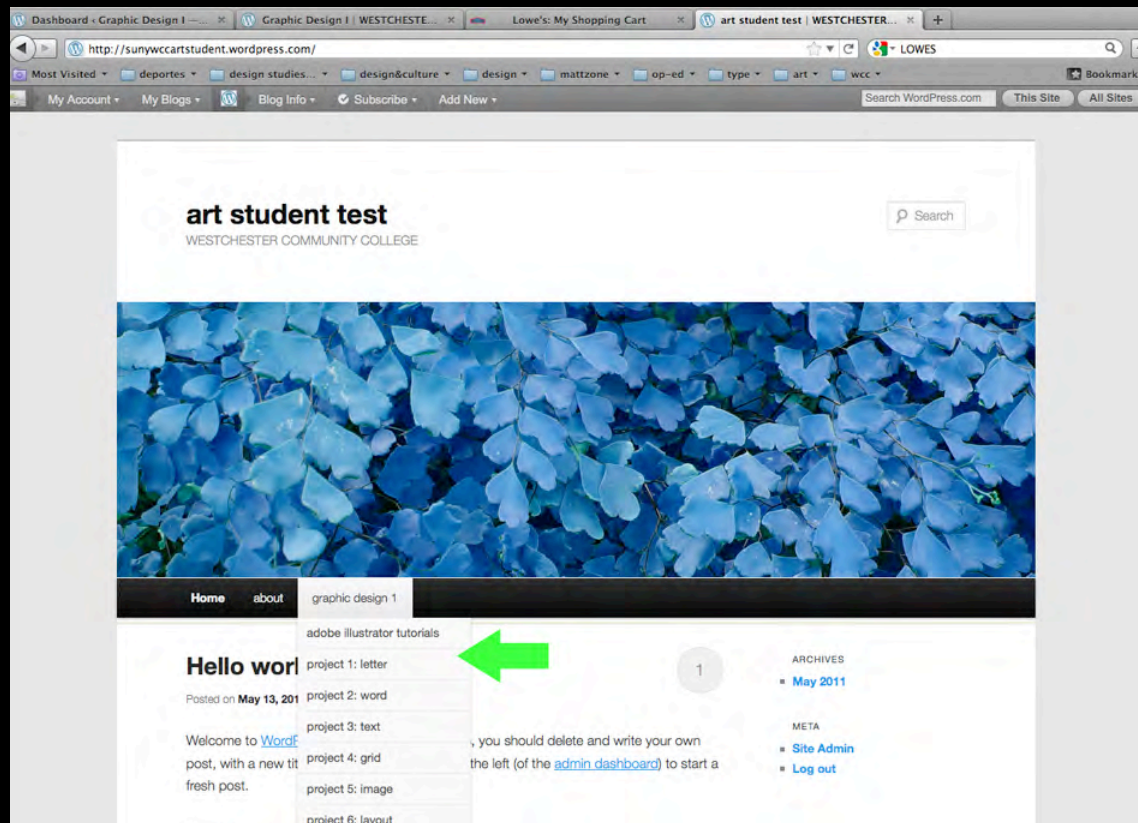

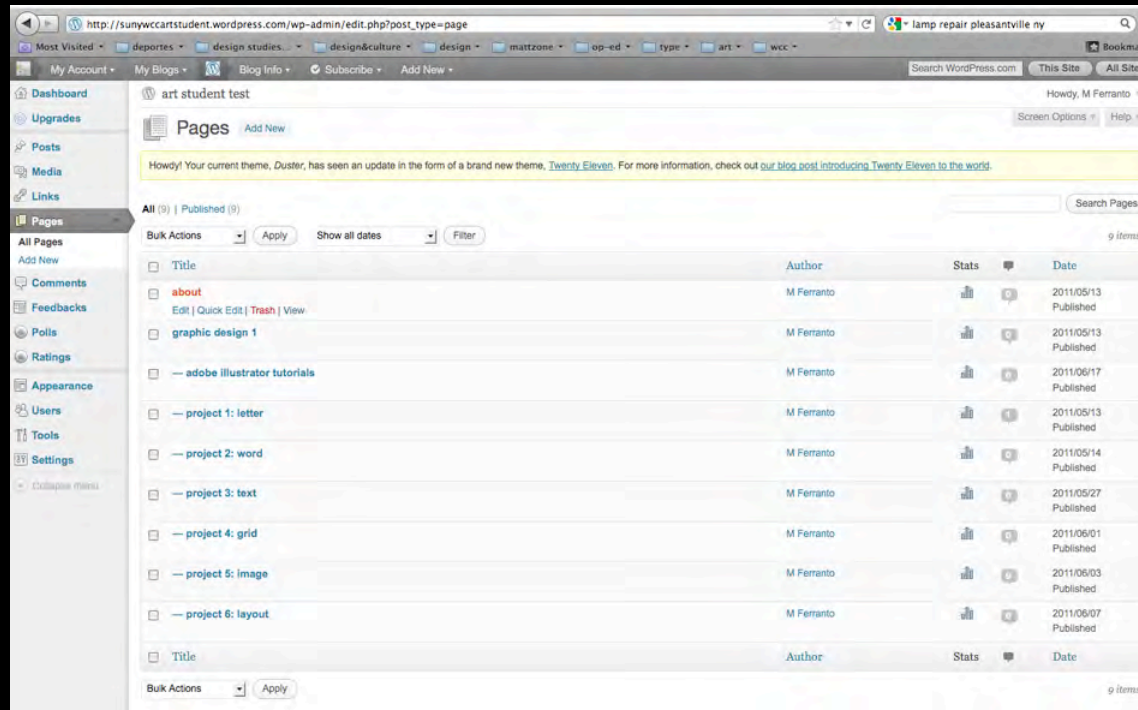

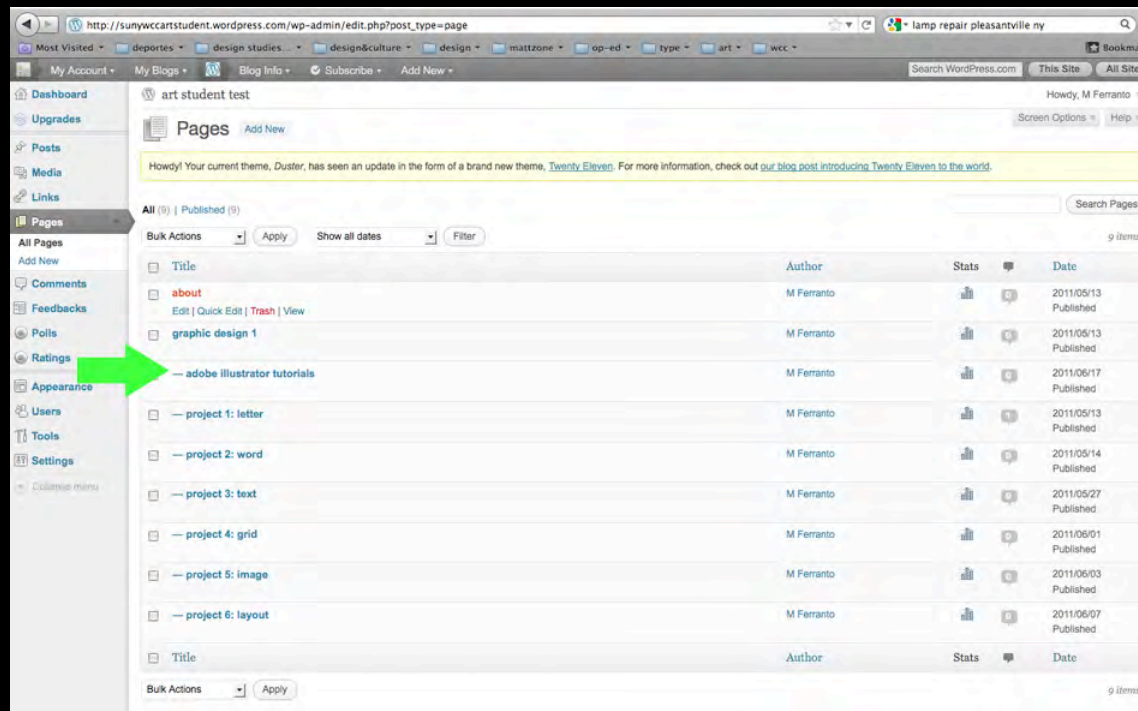

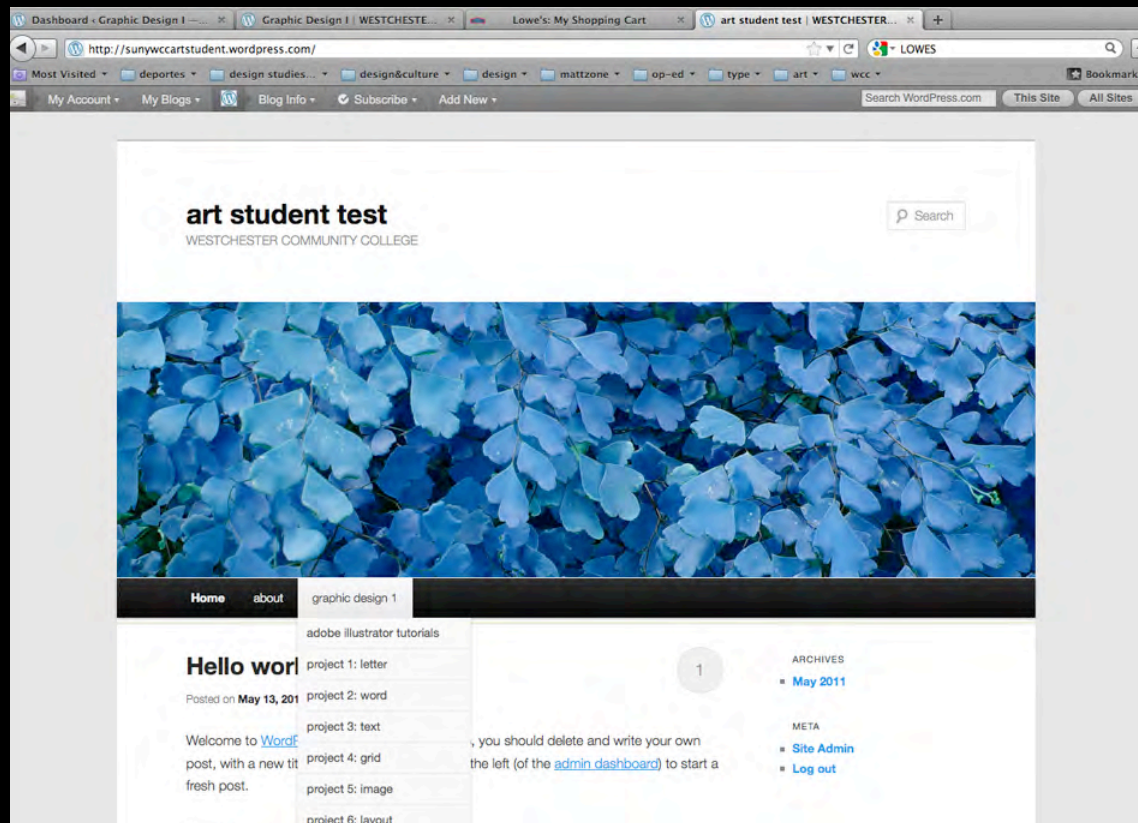
